

IF YOU DON'T CALL 8-1-1 BEFORE YOU DIG YOU MAY BE CALLING 9-1-1 TO REPORT AN EMERGENCY

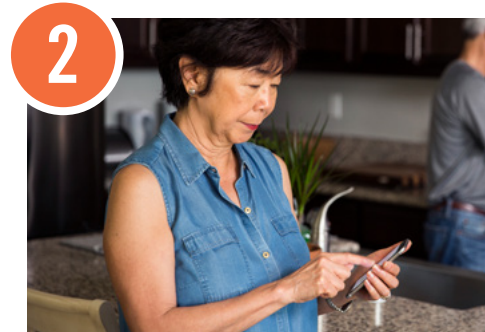


- Local utility companies will mark underground lines for small or large projects for free.
- Every six minutes in the U.S., a utility line is cut by an accidental dig.



IDENTIFY

Mark where you will be digging in white paint, flags or sticks indicating your project area for utilities to inspect.



CALL 8-1-1 AND WAIT

Call at least two working days before you dig. Leave your address, project start date and type of digging you have planned. You will be issued a ticket number listing the utilities in your area. Utility companies have 48 hours to identify underground lines.



VERIFY

Confirm each utility has come and marked potential underground line in distinct colors or has provided written/verbal confirmation.



DIG

Attempt to maintain the marks left by utilities while digging. Use hand tools if digging with 24" of marked underground lines. If marks cannot be maintained during project, or are lost, please call 8-1-1 to be remarked.



BE AWARE

While digging, pay attention to any unusual smells, dying vegetation or hissing noises. Do not attempt to fix any leaks, leave the area and notify PG&E immediately.
