

I am proud that we gather to honor their sacrifice, comfort their loved ones, and salute the fortitude and commitment of those who fight on every day in service to their state and community.

Brothers and sisters, we will never forget you.

### HOWARD PHEATTE

Foreman, Oakland Fire Department September 20, 1884

Howard Pheatte was Foreman of Phoenix Engine Company No. 1 and was revered by his peers. It was said he was a man of irreproachable character and unquestioned reputation, and these



qualities had made him a favorite with his fellow firemen. Howard succumbed to injuries he sustained from fighting a fire that occurred at a medical college in September 1884.

### HENRY DOODY

Hoseman, Oakland Fire Department September 18, 1939

Henry Doody embodied the finest qualities of a true firefighter and was a highly respected member of the Oakland Fire Department who served the citizens of Oakland with honor and distinction for 32 years. He began his career



in 1907 as a Substitute Driver and loved everything about the fire service. He passed away from a job-related illness in September 1939. At the time of his death, Henry was survived by his wife and two sons.



### EARL JONES

Captain, Oakland Fire Department December 26, 1944

Earl Jones began his career as a Hoseman and served the citizens of Oakland with pride and distinction for 30 years. Ever an example, Earl was a highly respected member of the Oakland Fire Department who led by



example and embodied the finest qualities of a true firefighter. He passed away in December 1944 from a heart attack. At the time of his death, Earl was survived by his wife and three children.

### JAMES WALDMEIER

Fire Chief, City of San Luis Obispo October 7, 1956

James Waldmeier served the citizens of San Luis Obispo with honor and pride for 14 years. He began his career as a civilian firefighter at Camp San Luis Obispo prior to joining the City of San Luis Obispo in 1942.



James passed away from a heart attack while fighting a residential fire. At the time of his passing, he was survived by his wife and two children.



### VICTOR VEGA

Fire Department November 7, 2005

Victor Vega served the citizens of Richmond with honor and distinction for over 30 years. He began his career as a firefighter and finished his career as a firefighter, sharing



his knowledge and experience, training dozens of new firefighters. Outside of work, he loved to play poker, the 49ers, enjoyed golf and was a semi-pro bowler in his younger years. Victor passed away from job-related cancer and is survived by his wife and three children.

### STEPHEN LEONG

Captain, Fresno Fire Department December 31, 2015

Stephen Leong served the citizens of Fresno for more than 32 years. He loved the fire service, fire engines, Chinese American History, and spending time at the ocean. Stephen



succumbed to job-related cancer and passed away in December 2015. Stephen is survived by his wife and three children.



### TIMOTHY J. MROZINSKI

Chief, Rocklin Fire Department June 6, 2017

As a young boy, Timothy J. Mrozinski wanted to follow in his father's footsteps to become a firefighter. He began his career as a firefighter in 1969 with the Carmichael Fire District working



through the ranks of Firefighter, Fire Engineer, and Fire Captain. He joined the Rocklin Fire Department in 1977 and served the citizens of Rocklin with honor and distinction for 27 years. Timothy enjoyed vacationing with his family, coaching youth sports, and participating in the California Firemen's Muster Association where he competed with antique fire equipment. He passed away in June 2017 from jobrelated cancer and is survived by his two children.

### DANIEL J. GEARY

Firefighter, CAL FIRE July 5, 2018

From the age of four, Daniel Geary knew he wanted to be a firefighter and later followed his two uncles into the fire service. He began his firefighting career with the Valley Center Fire Department in



San Diego County before joining CAL FIRE in the San Diego Unit in 2013 as a Fire Fighter II. Daniel served the citizens of California with honor and distinction for over 15 years, leaving a lasting impact on CAL FIRE and the communities he served. Outside of his work, Daniel loved surfing, motorcycle riding, working out and music. He passed away in July 2018 from a jobrelated illness.



## STEPHEN WAKEFIELD

Fire Chief, Crescent City Fire Rescue April 26, 2019

Stephen Wakefield always wanted to be a firefighter and followed his father's footsteps in 1976 and joined the Crescent City Volunteer Fire Department, where he served as a Firefighter, Captain,



Battalion Chief, Assistant Chief, and finally Fire Chief. He served with intensity, passion, dedication and a burning desire to do the best job possible. In 2015, Chief Wakefield was a major influence in integrating Crescent City Volunteer Fire Department and the Crescent Fire Protection District to create one department that serves the needs of this community. Stephen served as Chief of that new department, Crescent City Fire and Rescue, from its inception until 2018. He passed away in April 2019 from a job-related illness.

## PEDER C. MCELROY

Captain, Branciforte Fire Protection District May 30, 2020

Peder C. McElroy served the citizens of Santa Cruz with honor and pride for 24 years. Prior to his career in the fire service, he served in the U.S. Navy. Peder began his long career in the fire



service as a volunteer. Ever an example, he received Firefighter of the Year in 2000. He passed away from a jobrelated illness in May 2020. Peder is survived by his wife and four children.

### KYLE RUTHERFORD

Engineer, Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District March 20, 2021

Kyle Rutherford followed in his father's footsteps into a career in the fire service. Kyle began his career as a Firefighter with the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire



District in 2015 and was later promoted to Engineer in April 2018, proudly serving and protecting the Sacramento community of North Highlands. Outside of his work, he was an avid outdoorsman enjoying camping, hunting, and fishing. He passed away from a job-related cardiac event in March 2021.



## MATTHEW ROMINGER

Firefighter/Paramedic, Mountain Warfare Fire Department May 16, 2021

Matthew M. 'Bear'
Rominger was a
dedicated public
servant. He worked
as a police officer,
firefighter and
paramedic in a
career that spanned



over three decades. Matthew was a member of multiple departments, special teams and responded to thousands of calls throughout his service. Outside of work, he coached youth basketball and invested heavily into his family through football, soccer, hockey, and many other sports. He passed away in May 2021 from job-related COVID-19 complications. Matthew is survived by his wife and four children.



### JEFFREY VITTI

Captain, Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District June 1, 2021

Jeffrey Vitti served in the Air Force, both active and in reserve status, for seven full years before pursuing his career in the fire service. Jeffrey became interested,



like many in his generation, watching the show "Emergency" when he was a kid. Outside of his work he loved scuba diving, traveling, playing the guitar, and spending time with his family. He passed away from job-related cancer in June 2021.

## ANTHONY CANO

Firefighter Paramedic, Lakeside Fire Protection District July 8, 2021

Anthony Cano served the citizens of the Lakeside Fire Protection District with honor and distinction for five years. He loved the fire service



and began his career as a Reserve Firefighter with Lakeside Fire District and shortly after, promoted to a Firefighter Paramedic. His involvement in the district included mentoring new paramedic students and reserve firefighters and he enjoyed participating in the Lakeside Firefighters charity softball team. Anthony passed away in July of 2021 from a job-related illness and is survived by his two children.



### MARCUS PACHECO

Assistant Fire Engine Operator, United States Forest Service September 2, 2021

Marcus Pacheco loved the fire service and began his fire service career in 1988. Prior to joining the United States Forest Service, he worked for Susan River Fire



Protection District as a volunteer firefighter. In addition to his extensive career, he served as a Volunteer Firefighter and Training Officer for the Standish-Litchfield Fire Protection District. Marcus passed away from complications of job-related COVID-19. He is survived by his wife and three children.

### MATTHEW BRABO

Captain, CAL FIRE February 1, 2022

As a little boy, Matthew 'Matt' Brabo knew he wanted to be a firefighter and began his career in 2001 as a Firefighter I in the Nevada-Yuba-Placer Unit (NEU) with CAL FIRE. He embodied the finest



qualities of a true Fire Captain and served the citizens of California with honor and distinction for over 20 years. Matthew was appointed Fire Captain in 2016, taking a position with the CAL FIRE Training Center in lone, where he continued his service until his passing. He enjoyed being outdoors and duck hunting, but his priority was his family. Matthew passed away from a job-related illness in February of 2022. Matthew is survived by his wife and two daughters.



### STEVEN MCCANN

Captain, Los Angeles County Fire Department February 9, 2022

Steven McCann dedicated 16 years of his life to the fire service. He was highly respected and an esteemed Department member who embodied



our core values of courage, caring, and community, both on and off duty. Steven passed away from a medical emergency while responding to a 9-1-1 call in February 2022. He is survived by his daughters.

### NICKOLAS RAMIREZ III

Firefighter/Paramedic, San Diego City Fire Department February 16, 2022

Nickolas "Nick" Ramirez III joined the San Diego Fire-Rescue Department in May of 2003 and graduated from the 60th Basic Fire Academy. He was a



firefighter/paramedic and worked at stations 10, 23 and 34. In 2014, Nick was promoted to deputy fire marshal in the Community Risk Reduction Division which was his most recent assignment. Nick passed away in February 2022 from complications of job-related COVID. He is survived by his wife and two daughters.



### HEATH KELLY

Firefighter/Paramedic, South San Francisco Fire Department March 4, 2022

Heath Kelly served the citizens of South San Francisco with honor and pride for 16 years. He began his career as an Emergency Medical Technician and joined



South San Francisco Fire Department as a Firefighter/ Paramedic. He loved the fire service and during his career, he served as a Paramedic Field Training Officer, a Technical Rescue Specialist, and was qualified as an Acting Fire Apparatus Engineer and Acting Captain. He passed away from a job-related illness in March 2022. Heath is survived by his wife and daughter.

Captain, National City Fire Department May 1, 2022

Roberto Medina always had a strong interest and desire to help people in his community. He began his 22-yearlong career as a firefighter and was the first department-



sponsored paramedic. Roberto also served as the Union President and received the St. Florian Award in 1996. He was an avid outdoorsman, fisherman, hunter, and excellent chef. Roberto passed away from a jobrelated illness in May 2022. He is survived by his wife and daughter.



### JACK E. SHEPPARD

Engineer, San Ramon Valley Fire Protection District July 6, 2022

Jack Sheppard started his fire service career with the California Department of Forestry in 1974. During his 45-year career he also worked for the U.S.



Forest Service and in the private ambulance industry as an EMT. Jack was awarded a commendation for "outstanding recruit" in his academy class of 1986. He also managed the District's small hand tool program where he coordinated, inventoried, and repaired chainsaws and various other tools, and assisted with in-service training on new wildland apparatus. Jack's interests outside of the fire service included fishing, horseback riding and weightlifting. He passed away from job-related cancer in July 2022.
